





Financial Information and Assistance

Here are a few options to consider to help finance your education:

1. Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP), Ontario.ca/osap

The Student Financial Aid Office at Ridgetown Campus administers OSAP to eligible students. The office is available to answer any questions you may have about OSAP in general or about the application process. OSAP is designed to assist students with a portion of the costs of their post-secondary education. Students are encouraged to apply for OSAP when the application opens in spring every year to avoid any delays in processing their application; students don't need to wait until they register into courses to apply.

OSAP funding is usually made up of a combination of loans and grants from the provincial and federal governments and is available to students in full-time or part-time studies. Any loans received during your studies will need to be paid back whereas grants will not need to be paid back.

***Note:** Students studying in the Associate Diploma in Veterinary Technology Alternative Delivery are only eligible to apply for part-time OSAP funding in the fall and winter semesters and full-time OSAP funding in the summer semester.

Students from other Canadian provinces/territories should inquire what funding is available to them through their home province/territory. Visit your provincial/territorial government's website for detailed student aid information.


2. Student Line of Credit

Student Awards

Ridgetown Campus' Student Awards program is made up of a combination of scholarships, financial need scholarships, bursaries, in-course awards, academic proficiency awards, and graduation awards. Information on the Student Awards Program is sent out to students via their email in mid-to-late August with the anticipated available awards for the upcoming academic year.

The application process for available student awards varies—some awards require a student-written letter, a Needs Assessment Form (sent out by the Awards Coordinator), a completed, error-free OSAP application, or some awards students are automatically considered for based on committee nomination or academic proficiency. Application details are outlined in the Student Awards Program.

Incoming students are encouraged to check out the Student Awards Program to see what entrance awards and bursaries they may want to consider applying for.

Note: Any awards received by OSAP recipients (excluding needs-based bursaries) through the Student Awards Program will be reported as income on a student's OSAP application by the Financial Aid Office.



Single room availability is determined by the number of applications to residence received by the application deadline.

The meal plan includes 14 meals per week, from Monday morning breakfast through to Friday lunch. The Steckley Hall kitchenette remains open for students staying on campus during the weekends as there is no food service available. What is an Apprentice?

An apprentice is someone who learns a skilled trade on the job, under the direction of more experienced employees. Apprentices also complete classroom instruction as a part of their training. Ninety percent of the apprenticeship is on-the-job, and ten percent is classroom-based training. Apprentices are employees, so you can earn while you learn the trade. You will need to find an employer who is willing to train you.

What Does a Dairy Herdsperson Do?

A dairy herdsperson is a person who is responsible for the maintenance, health, nutrition, and breeding of dairy cows. They milk, feed and water cows, and work with

milking and sterilizing equipment. They perform herd health procedures, routine herd maintenance, and operate and maintain barn mechanical systems and farm equipment. Dairy Herdsperson is a voluntary certified trade and an apprenticeship will increase your knowledge and your opportunities.

To Become a Dairy Herdsperson Apprentice

To become an apprentice dairy herdsperson, you should complete your Grade 12 diploma or equivalent.

Applying to be an Apprentice

To apply to be an apprentice, you must have a sponsor (usually your employer) who has agreed to provide you with apprenticeship training. If you want to learn more about apprenticeship training to get help finding a sponsor, please contact Katie Hunter at katieh@uoguelph.ca. To find the closest office to you, visit ontario.ca/page/employment-ontarioapprenticeship-offices. Once you have a sponsor, there are four steps in the apprenticeship registration process:

STEP ONE:

Complete an Application for Apprenticeship Training. If you've found an employer to sponsor your training and you are at least 18 years old, you can apply online at ontario.ca/page/start-apprenticeship. You can also call 1.800.387.5656.

STEP TWO:

Someone from the Employment Ontario apprenticeship office will contact you and your sponsor about signing and registering a Training Agreement.

STEP THREE:

After you have your Training Agreement, apply for membership to the Ontario College of Trades by completing a Member Application Form (Apprentices Class). Visit Ontario College of Trades website at collegeoftrades.ca/membership/become-a-member for more information.

STEP FOUR:

You will receive an Offer of Classroom Training from the Ministry of Labour, Training, and

Skills Development. When you get your offer letter, follow the instructions to register into the apprenticeship in-school training at Ridgetown Campus.

In-School Training (10% of program hours)


The in-school training delivered by the University of Guelph Ridgetown Campus focuses primarily on the theory you need to support the skills in the Apprenticeship Training Standard. To complete the in-school training, you must attend 16 four-day blocks (Tuesday through Friday) during your apprenticeship period, scheduled once per month from September to April over a two-year period (total of 480 hours).

Our Admission Requirements Have Recently Changed. What's Changed?

The Health Occupations Aptitude Examination (HOAE) pre-admission testing is no longer one of the admission requirements.

ABOUT YOUR SPECIFIC COURSE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Specific Course Requirements from Current Ontario Secondary School Curriculum

Minimum admission requirements to the Associate Diploma in Veterinary Technology (Conventional or Alternative Delivery) are as follows.

The following courses are required:

- **English:** Grade 11 **AND** Grade 12 C or U English
- **Math:** Grade 11 C or Grade 11 M **AND** 12 C Math, or any Grade 12 U Math
- **Biology:** Grade 11 C or U Biology
- **Chemistry:** Grade 12 C or Grade 11 U Chemistry

Each of 6 courses listed above must have:

- A minimum final grade of 75% at the 'C' level
- A minimum final grade of 65% at the 'U' or 'M' level

Specific Course Requirements from Prior Ontario Secondary School Curriculum

Minimum admission requirements to the Associate Diploma in Veterinary Technology (Conventional or Alternative Delivery) are as follows:

At the Advanced Level

- Applicants must have credits in the following 6 courses: **Chemistry** (Grade 11), **Biology** (Grade 11), **Math** (Grade 11 **AND** 12), **English** (Grade 11 **AND** 12), each with a minimum final grade of 65%.

At the General Level

- Applicants must have credits in the following 6 courses: **Chemistry** (Grade 11), **Biology** (Grade 11), **Math** (Grade 11 **AND** 12), **English** (Grade 11 **AND** 12), each with a minimum final grade of 75%.

Submission of High School and Prior Post-Secondary Transcripts

All applicants must submit their high school transcripts, and, if applicable, any prior post-secondary transcripts, for admission consideration.

IMPORTANT ADMISSION NOTES

1. Oversubscribed Program

The Conventional delivery is oversubscribed.

2. Application Assessment

Your assessment will be 100% based on your academic grades.

3. Applying under Mature Student Status

All applicants to the program must possess their high school diploma or equivalent to be considered for admission into the program. Mature Student Status (19 years of age or older but do not possess high school diploma or equivalent) does not apply.

4. Rabies Immunization on Campus

It is a mandatory requirement that students are vaccinated against rabies and hold a valid titre. It is recommended that students have their booster series completed (and titre checked) before starting the program, but if not possible, an opportunity will be provided the first week of classes.

5. This is a physically demanding program.

International Student Admissions & Fees

Ridgetown Campus welcomes international student applications to all of our diploma and certificate programs!

The official secondary school (high school) graduation certificate/diploma that would admit you to an internationally-recognized university in your home country is normally acceptable for applications to our programs.

For further details on out-of-country admission requirements, including the General Certificate of Education (GCE), please refer to our website at admission.uoguelph.ca/international.

Applying to Programs & Supporting Documents Required:

- All program applications go through ontariocolleges.ca, with an application deadline of **March 1, 2021** (Veterinary Technology deadline: February 1, 2021).
- Supporting documentation (Assessed/translated transcripts, English Proficiency scores) must be submitted by **April 1, 2021** (Veterinary Technology deadline: February 14, 2021).
- Official documents should come directly from the issuing institution or accreditation body. Where English translations are needed, please have the verified documents supplied for consideration.
- Post-secondary **transcripts must be assessed by World Education Services (WES). Both a credentialed assessment and a course-by-course assessment is required.** Supporting documentation can be sent directly to Ridgetown Campus Registrar's office or to ontariocolleges.ca, to be posted to the applicant's application profile.


